Learning Skills

Through our inquiry we continue to teach specific learning skills. Children are recognised for these skills through the weekly Learning Skills Class award. The skills we encourage children to develop are: **Thinking, research, communication, social and self-management skills.**

Sing 2: part songs as duets or melody and accompaniment with accurate pitching. Understand contrasting traditions and stories.
