Book change

It's really important children continue to read as much as possible outside of school. Reading books will continue to be changed frequently throughout the week. Please make sure that you have listened to and checked your child's understanding of their reading book. When finished, please sign, recording any comments in the Reading Record Book. There are some suggestions at the front of each Reading Record book for discussion points with your child.

Reading Awards



The reading awards scheme has been popular amongst our pupils and has had a positive impact on the quality, enjoyment and engagement with reading. It will continue again this term, here are some reminders.

1) The books that are counted towards the awards have to be books from the school reading scheme.

2) We have revised the Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum requirements.

- Bronze - Read 50 times
- Silver - Read 100 times
- Gold - Read 150 times
- Platinum - Read 200 times

Learning Conversations

It's been great to see children engaging with the learning conversations and the work and discussions children have been having at home around their school learning. Please do encourage and support your child to complete these as they are a useful way to help them cement their learning and share their school week with you. Thank you for your continued support.

Reception Phonics

This term we will be continuing with Level 4 of our phonic programme 'Twinkl Phonics'. The main aims with Level 4 phonics are:

- to consolidate children's knowledge of graphemes in reading and spelling words, especially digraphs and trigraphs;
- to introduce words with adjacent consonants e.g. milk, nest and hand.
- to learn polysyllabic words and learn to read and spell some more tricky words.

This will be delivered daily, through short lessons in which will introduce a different phoneme/initial sound each day, play sound games, learn to blend and segment words using our sound knowledge and learn our tricky words. This term we will be revisiting the Consonant digraphs ch, sh, th, ng and the Vowel Digraphs ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure and er. We will be revisiting the tricky words to, the, go, no, I, into, we, she, he, me, my, they, was, her and all. We will be learning the Level 4 tricky words so, said, have, like, come, some, were, there, little, one, do, when, out and what.

Games/PE

Pine class have Games on Monday with our Sports Coaches and PE on Tuesday with the Reception Team. On a Monday and a Tuesday your child can wear their kit to school. Please ensure your child has warm clothing e.g. jogging bottoms and track suit jacket/jumper to wear.

Sun Hats and Sun Cream

The children spend a large part of their school day outside at play times and in our garden as part of their continuous provision. Please can we ask that children bring a named sun hat to school now the weather is getting warmer and wear sun screen to school.

Reception Forest School

Reception children will continue to have Forest School on a Thursday with Ms Groves. Please can your child bring a named waterproof coat, wellies, sun hat and wear sun cream.

Reception School Trip - Pirate Picnic on the Beach!

We will be taking Pine Class to the beach this term for a pirate picnic. The trip will involve our 'Pine Class Ship Mates' listening to pirate stories, learning pirate facts from long ago, singing sea shanties and enjoying an ice cream on the beach.
