Learning Skills

Through our inquiry we continue to teach specific learning skills. Children are recognised for these skills through the weekly Learning Skills Class Award. The skills we encourage children to develop are: **thinking, research, communication, social and self-management skills.**

Writing

At the beginning of Year 1 we shall be exploring things that are familiar to us by reading the book, In Every House on Every Street by Jess Hitchman. Then we will look at the picture book Chalk by Bill Thomson to start some simple short bursts of writing. Finally, we shall study Shh We have a Plan by Chris Houghton to practice following a simple story plot and creating our own version.

Spellings

The children will start to have weekly spellings to learn based on the phonic sound we are learning. Spellings are set on Friday with a spelling quiz the following Thursday morning.

Maths

Our main focus will be on understanding, reading and writing numbers to 10.

We shall develop place value knowledge by partitioning numbers to 10, finding one more and one less, using symbols and comparing numbers.

Reading

The children will begin developing early comprehension skills through weekly Guided Reading lessons. Through shared reading, they will discuss vocabulary, learn reading skills and link their own experiences.

Humanities

Geography: We shall be studying our local area in the south-west of the UK. We will explore the key human and physical features found on maps. Next, we shall use directional language to navigate around the school use compass directions and simple keys.

RE: To start the term, we will explore the term 'world view'. The children will then explore the very first story in the bible, The Creation Story, and come to understand that Christians believe that this creation story is how the world was made.

Science

This term, the children will be making observations of Autumn in readiness to notice how the environment changes across the year. We will focus on observing the weather, trees and plants, and the activities people enjoy as the seasons change. The children will use their senses to explore the world around them and collect and sort Autumn objects.

Art

We will be drawing and painting self-portraits and studying Giuseppe Arcimboldo to inspire our fruit and vegetable faces!

Then we shall practice mixing cold and hot colours to create collages based on the illustrations of Chris Houghton.

PE

Sports Masters: Rugby skills.

Class PE: Playground games and Fundamental PE skills.

PE Days will be Monday and Friday.

PSHE

In our topic this term, Being Me, the children will talk about who they are, what makes them special and how they belong to different groups. They explore how to feel proud of themselves, recognise their emotions and understand how their choices and behaviour can affect others.

Music

This term, we will be Rhyming in Time: using the beat/pulse to keep in time. We will be learning to chant, rap and sing using different voices.

Computing

We shall be introducing Y1 Online Safety and using Teach Computing to look at technology around us.

Useful General information



Reading Books

Please read with your child **every day**. Those children who read with their parents everyday are shown to be at a significant advantage educationally and it helps them to feel confident at keeping up with the pace of the Year 1 phonics teaching.

Reading books will be issued during the first week back. Please could all children bring in their reading books every day. Reading books will be changed after your child has **read it twice (and signed twice)** - once for decoding and once for fluency and comprehension. If you have read with your child please make sure you have signed the reading record and sent both the reading book and record back into school so we can change them.

At the start of Year 1, we begin the teaching the Level 5 Phonics. To help you know which diagraph* your child will be learning throughout each week, a phoneme pronunciation and parent support sheet will be sent home on Dojo. This is an optional activity, but we recommend completing this with your child to help consolidate their phonics learning. (*diagraph - two letters that together make one sound e.g. ch, sh, oa)



Reading awards

The reading awards scheme is popular amongst our pupils and has had a positive impact on the quality, enjoyment and engagement with reading. Here are a few reminders about how it works:

- 1) The books that are counted towards the awards have to be books from the school reading scheme.
- 2) If your child completes their daily reading with you, they will collect one point. Therefore, 7 points can be collected each week. If your child reads every day, they should be achieving their Platinum badge in the summer term.

Bronze – 50 reads

Silver – 100 reads

Gold – 150 reads

Platinum – 200 reads



Reading for pleasure

We encourage all reading for pleasure - a family story book at bedtime, reading a comic or magazine, information books etc. We read many story books in class and later in the term the children will have access to a library book each Friday. Please ensure any library books borrowed are returned each Friday ready for choosing a new book to borrow.



Spellings

All Year 1s will have spellings to learn in their Home Spelling Book. Each Friday they will have a list of words to learn over the weekend and throughout the following week and then there will be a quiz each Thursday. The list of spellings will be stuck into the right-hand side of their Home Spelling Book with the following pages to be used for practicing their spellings each week at home. These spellings will be linked to phonic sound/key word work taking place in the classroom. Please ensure the Home Spelling Book is returned to school every Thursday so spelling results can be added and they can be prepared for the new spelling list.



Labelling

Please ensure all clothing and belongings are labelled – especially jumpers, cardigans, hoodies and coats. Please also write new names on any second hand items.

Learning Conversations: In your child's Learning Conversation Book, they will have an activity to do at home with you which helps to develop good learning practices and connections between home and school. This book will be sent home on Friday afternoon to be returned the following Friday morning.

Games/PE: Hazel class have PE on a Monday with Sports Masters and on a Friday with Mrs Farnie. Please make sure that your child wears their PE kit to school on these days. Later in the term, when the weather is colder, please ensure your child has warm clothing e.g. jogging bottoms and hoodie/jumper to wear. Please ensure that all clothing is labelled, including second hand clothing that has been purchased.

Medical Conditions: Please keep us updated of any existing or new medical conditions that your child may have as well as making sure their medicines are in date and kept in school. All medication must be accompanied with full instructions for use and a medical form needs to be completed at the office (this includes antibiotic, cream and inhalers).

Water Bottles, Fruit and Milk Scheme: We encourage children to bring in **water** to drink during the day when they are in class. Please make sure that the bottle is clearly named. This is in addition to their lunch box drink and again is for water only. If your child would like milk this term please speak to the office about a milk ordering form.

Show & Tell: In Year 1 all the children enjoy being 'line leader' for the day and can bring an item from home they wish to show and talk about with the class (they will all have this role several times and selection follows the register). This helps build their confidence with talking to the whole class and they all practice asking and answering questions.

Information: We send updates or notices via our Class Dojo page. You should have received a QR code enabling you to log into this. If there are any issues with using Class Dojo, please let us know. The Tapestry program only runs in Reception. Please do not use Class Dojo to alert the school of an absence, but contact the school office who will pass on any messages.
